MISSION OF THE CALIFORNIA CADET CORPS

The first general mission of the California Cadet Corps is to provide the schools of the State of California with courses in military instruction as an integral part of the school curriculum. As a part of this mission the California Cadet Corps provides a central headquarters and a statewide organization for military cadet units throughout the State of California.

The second general mission of the Corps is to provide at state expense uniforms, rifles, ammunition, and other training equipment to California schools participating in the California Cadet Corps

The third general mission of the Corps is to make available to participating schools the services of traveling regional representatives of the California Cadet Corps who visit the schools and assist local instructors in handling, training, supply, and administrative problems which might arise.

OBJECTIVES OF THE CALIFORNIA CADET CORPS

1. To develop the quality of leadership which will be useful in civilian life and the military service. 2. To assist the schools in educating our youth for citizenship by training the cadets to work together as a team.

3. To develop as solid sense of patriotism in the cadets and to teach them the limited role of the

military in a democracy.

4. To encourage the cadets to develop a wellrounded standard of knowledge an outstanding scholastic record and to secure the greatest

amount of education.

5. To assist cadets to understand basic military concepts in case they are, at some future time, called into service; also, to provide background for college ROTC, service academies and armed forces reserve.

CALIFORNIA CADET CORPS ACTIVITIES

State of California sponsored activities include rifle team competition, drill team competition, regional leadership schools, field trips, and summer encampment for California Cadet Corps units.
